Tracey Gravel, the Office Coordinator of the Downtown Surrey BIA, along with the assistance of student interns over the past two years, has undertaken a heartwarming initiative of creating Welcome Baskets for new homeowners at King George Hub and residents moving into "The Line," a new rental high-rise. These thoughtful baskets have been filled with an assortment of local items, aiming to provide an inviting welcome to the community.

Among the items included in the baskets are beautifully crafted candles or glassware made by Studio 73. Located in Surrey and supported by the Community Living Society, Studio 73 is a creative space where a group of talented glass artists come together to produce stunning glassware, decorative pieces, and wearable art. These artists, supported by a team of professionals, are highly skilled in various techniques of glass molding and fusing, bringing their original designs to life.

The Welcome Baskets have also featured locally sourced items, such as honey and soap from the Honeybee Centre, a trusted supplier known for their quality products. Additionally, resin coasters from a local artesian and herb planters from 99 Nursery and Florist have been included, adding a touch of nature and beauty to the baskets.

To further enhance the experience for new residents, a variety of gift cards to local businesses within King George Hub were included, allowing them to explore and support the vibrant community they now call home.

While the Downtown Surrey BIA took the lead on assembling the Welcome Baskets, the funding for this gesture came from PCI Developments. Their generous support extended a special welcome to new residents, creating a sense of belonging and community from the moment they arrive.

The impact of these Welcome Baskets has reached beyond the local community, capturing the attention of social media users as far as Brazil. The popularity of these thoughtful gestures among the new residents has resulted in the baskets trending on social media platforms, generating positive attention, and showcasing the warm hospitality of Surrey to a global audience.









Juice Box Heroes

Ryley Patterson and Chloe Gravel-Fallis are not your average kids. From a young age, they showed a remarkable dedication to helping others through fundraising efforts. Their journey began when Ryley, just two years old, started donating toys to the Surrey Christmas Bureau. By the time she turned five, Ryley, with the help of her best friend Chloe, organized an Annual Spaghetti Dinner as a "funraiser" to collect toys and funds for the bureau, simply because "kids like toys and toys are fun."

Their first event was a success, gathering four boxes of toys and over \$1500. Inspired by their achievement, the dynamic duo decided to raise funds for a new playground at Bolivar Park by selling hot dogs and lemonade outside Save-On Foods. But they didn't stop there. Ryley and Chloe teamed up with their cousin Aubrey Leeson, who was just two and a half years old at the time, to sell SunRype Juice at local events such as Canada Day, Fusion Festival, and Movies Under the Stars.

Their efforts yielded great results, as they donated over \$800 to the Centre for Child Development in their first year of selling juice. Over time, more cousins joined their fundraising team, including Sienna Swartz-Lahue, Chase Swartz-Lahue, Kaydence Swartz-Lahue, Alexander Patterson, Bella Patterson, Delilah Patterson, and Hunter Patterson. This year, the team of young philanthropists, now aged between three and thirteen and a half, continues to make a difference alongside Ryley, Chloe, and Aubrey.

For Chase, this fundraiser holds a special place in his heart. As a preschooler, he received rehabilitative care at the Centre for Child Development, making their cause even more meaningful. The children's dedication to their mission is evident as they eagerly await the start of each summer to begin selling juice once again. Thanks to SunRype's support, they have already raised over \$4000 and have accumulated a total of over \$20,000 for various organizations, including the Surrey Christmas Bureau, Surrey Food Bank, the Centre for Child Development, the YMCA, and the playground at Bolivar Heights.



Ryley, Chloe, and their team of Juice Box Heroes serve as an inspiration to us all, reminding us that small acts of kindness and determination can create a significant impact. Their unwavering commitment to helping others demonstrates the power of community and the potential within young hearts.







During the initial Downtown Surrey BIA Community Safety Meeting in March, guest speakers including Deputy Chief of Surrey Fire Services, Jason Cairney, Staff Sergeant Nigel Pronger of the Surrey RCMP, City of Surrey Senior Social Planner, Aileen Murphy, and Councillor Rob Stutt, Chair of the Public Safety Committee, provided their expertise and perspectives on safety issues in the community.
