


WELCOME HARP, THE DSBIA'S NEW CHAIR

GOODBYE TO DELL LANES



I think we were all surprised at the recent news that the Dell Lanes was closing permanently. Many of us remember birthday celebrations, league competitions, and fun gatherings of friends and family. Its abrupt end of operations, transitioning from a hub of activity to a silent monument overnight, has only deepened the sense of shock.

The closure of The Dell Lanes marks another chapter in the community's recent history of loss, following the shuttering of the iconic Round-Up Cafe in 2021. Much like The Dell Lanes, the Round-Up Cafe held a special place in the hearts of locals, with fond memories and unwavering community support yet both victims of the pandemic.

Both The Dell Lanes and the Round-Up Cafe played integral roles as community pillars, extending their support and hospitality to countless individuals and organizations for over the sixty years.

The emotional response to their closures harkens back to a similar outpouring of sentiment witnessed in 2005, when Stardust Skating Center bid farewell to its patrons. Although the physical structure remained standing until 2021, the community continued to mourn its loss, as evidenced by the commemorative brick sales initiated by the property's new owners, with proceeds benefitting the Surrey Christmas Bureau.

In addition to the impact of the pandemic, Dell Lanes' closure also sheds light on broader societal shifts, including the effects gentrification. As neighborhoods evolve and demographics change, beloved establishments like the local bowling lanes often find themselves caught in the crosscurrents of economic transformation. While the closure may evoke a sense of loss and nostalgia, it also prompts reflection on the changing landscape of our communities. As we navigate these transitions, it becomes imperative to not only mourn the loss of cherished establishments but also to advocate for inclusive development policies that preserve the cultural heritage and social fabric of our neighborhoods.


