## **BOMA BC Award Winners**

The <u>BOMA BC</u> (Building Owners and Managers Association of British Columbia) awards are an opportunity to recognize the strategy, innovation, and excellence within the industry. This year, the team behind the operation of <u>King George Hub</u> received accolades in the categories of Emerging Leader and Building Operations Team of the Year. I had the pleasure of speaking with Ana Lagovschi, BOMA BC's Emerging Leader of the Year, about her career journey and aspirations. Ana, the general manager for King George Hub, has been with Warrington PCI Management for nine years and based in Surrey since 2021. She loves her job because of the diverse opportunities and variety of tasks she engages in every day.



Ana credited Lorna Park and Adam Spear as significant influences in her professional life and leadership style, appreciating the opportunities they've provided her. During our conversation, Ana humbly expressed feelings of imposter syndrome, often wondering, "Really? Me?" about receiving the award. Despite these feelings, Ana is a highly skilled and qualified property manager. Her main advice for upcoming property managers is to "roll with the punches," understanding that things may not always go as planned, making it easier to handle challenges. Ana attributes much of King George Hub's success to their exceptional building operations team, who also won a BOMA BC Award for Team of the Year. She described the team as a close-knit group that thrives on mutual respect and admiration, extending beyond their professional interactions. They hold frequent meetings to continuously improve their operations, enjoying the process along the way. The team cohesion is expected to contribute to the seamless opening of the newest phase in 2025, maintaining the standard set by previous phases.

# Safety Audit

For nearly two decades, the Downtown Surrey BIA has been gathering information on Downtown Surrey businesses' perceptions of safety. As Downtown Surrey is a diverse community in transition undergoing many social and environmental changes, including gentrification, it is especially important to see how these changes impact safety in the area. The audit surveys and takes input directly from businesses to make recommendations based on these concerns. While the BIA cannot directly fix these concerns, we can advocate for change on behalf of businesses. These recommendations make the area safer to work, live, and play. This year, the goal is to survey 150 ground-level businesses in an area that spans 94th avenue just past Surrey Memorial Hospital, all the way up to 112 avenue past Gateway SkyTrain station.

Over the years as the community continues to develop, it is interesting to see how issues relating to safety may change or persist. For instance, in 2016 there was an epidemic of discarded needles in the area by businesses, which created biohazards for people nearby. This led to the funding of the Surrey Rig Dig needle pickup program, which saw a reduction in discarded needles in the coming years. Last year in 2023, there were issues relating to people lighting fires in the area. The interns worked hard to make recommendations and give out pamphlets with relevant information to businesses on the prevention of fires in the area. This highlights the importance of how research impacts everyone in the community.

While data is still being collected, it will be interesting to see what the biggest issues are in 2024. So, if you are part of a business in the area who wants to make your voice heard, be on the lookout for Stella.

#### Grosvenor Rd. Green Space

The Grosvenor Greenspace is a large open plot of land that lies near the intersection of King George Boulevard and 108th Avenue in Downtown Surrey, between the surrounding streets of Grosvenor Road, Hilton Road, and Bentley Road.

This site was once home to the Grosvenor Road School, which was closed and demolished in 2000. Since then, the land has remained vacant, with most of its activity coming from the diagonal path that runs through the space leading to King George Boulevard. Arguably, it is most used by commuters walking to King George Boulevard from the nearby residential neighborhood.

The Grosvenor Greenspace has been of particular interest to the BIA this summer, as it continues to sit unused, yet with so much potential. Recognizing this, the BIA has initiated efforts to transform this space into a vibrant community hub.

In June, two BIA interns conducted surveys on nearby residents, businesses, and a shelter to gather feedback from those in the surrounding area on what they would like to see happen in the space this summer. The goal of this survey is to focus on appreciative inquiry, an approach that concentrates on utilizing positive questions to uncover existing strengths and positive attributes of a focal point. This method helps to identify what the community values and how best to enhance and utilize this space.



The BIA views this greenspace as a valuable asset for community engagement. We plan to use this expansive area for enjoyable activities this summer and want to incorporate the neighborhood's ideas into our vision, transforming this open land into a hub for making memories and bringing the community together, instead of letting it go unused.

Potential activities and events could range from outdoor concerts, fitness classes, or sports days. The goal is to create a dynamic and inclusive environment that encourages community interaction and participation. With the support and ideas of the community, the BIA is excited to see this greenspace come to life.
