Enjoy a variety of performances across four different stages featuring local musicians and dance groups. Free rides, such as the Ferris Wheel, Barrel of Monkeys, and the Pirate Ship are sure to keep you warm and entertained. Support local vendors at the holiday market, showcasing a wide range of artisanal products. Delight your taste buds at the "Enchanted Eats" pavilion, which offers unique sweets and delicious treats.

Make lasting memories by taking photos in the sparkling light tunnel and beside the over 500-foot "waterfall" of holiday lights. Meet Victoria Freinhofer, the DSBIA's Summer 2019 Special Events Intern.

She says it was "incredibly fulfilling" to witness the various elements of event planning, highlighting skills like communications, site logistics, stakeholder relationships, and sponsorships, that helped her "create a memorable experience for the attendees."



After working at the DSBIA, Victoria returned to Simon Fraser University to complete her Bachelor of Arts in Communications with a minor in Sociology, graduating in December 2019. It was at this time that the COVID-19 pandemic began, completely altering the job market and landscape of work across the province.
