I decided to pop in around 2 pm, after most people had finished lunch, for a quieter time. The lady at the front gave me a friendly welcome, which was nice in the quiet restaurant. I'm a student at SFU, studying communication, and I was actually looking for a local business to write about. Plus, Umami Ramen was close to my office, making it a convenient spot to try out.



The vibe of Umami Ramen was authentic and welcoming. It was clean, filled with Japanese decorations that made the space feel genuine and inviting. Despite its size and the number of tables, it maintained a cozy atmosphere. The lady running the place was super friendly and made me feel like I was more of a guest than a customer.

I was there for ramen but found out they serve a whole range of dishes, even South Asian ones like Tom Yum, Malaysian Roti Canai, and Hainanese Chicken. I stuck with my craving and ordered the beef ramen. As I waited, I tested out their Wi-Fi, thinking this could be a decent spot to work from occasionally. I also got a lemon tea, which was really refreshing, especially with real lemon slices in it.

SUPPORTIVE HOUSING ON BENTLEY ROAD

In response to the growing homelessness crisis in Surrey and the proposed construction of a supportive housing facility on Bentley Road, the Downtown Surrey Business Improvement Association (DSBIA) hosted a meeting at the Chuck Bailey Rec Centre on January 24. Attended by representatives from BC Housing, City of Surrey staff, Surrey Urban Mission, and businesses and residents, the central focus of the gathering was to gain insights into the proposed supportive housing facility on Bentley Road and to facilitate a meaningful dialogue.



Surrey Urban Mission, the current operators of the Safe Sleep housing across from Chuck Bailey Rec Centre, drew attention to the challenges faced by homeless individuals aged 50 and above, a significant demographic found within Safe Sleep. As the potential operator for the proposed 60-bed supportive housing facility on Bentley Road, they envision the facility as a means for sixty individuals to transition from shelters to long-term, sustainable placements.

BC Housing started the discussion by pointing out the 65% increase in homelessness within Surrey over the past three years. Preferring a solution beyond short-term shelters, they proposed a preference for supportive housing. This approach entails the provision of subsidized studio homes equipped with on-site support services, including meals, health, and education. Emphasizing the potential economic benefits to the community, BC Housing anticipated a reduction in expenditures related to health and correctional services.

The City of Surrey outlined a strategic vision to transition away from temporary housing solutions, such as bunk beds and small shelters in leased spaces. Their goal is to embrace more livable spaces in permanent purpose-built housing. The Bentley Road facility, partially funded through the federal Rapid Housing Initiative, is slated to be a six-story building featuring sixty suites. The targeted demographic comprises vulnerable populations that are homeless or at severe risk of homelessness.

An interactive session addressed pivotal concerns related to community acceptance, navigating challenges faced by couples in supported housing, and formulating strategies to ensure the seamless transition of individuals from existing shelters to new supportive housing. Stakeholders underscored the significance of behavior policies and transparent communication in fostering an environment conducive to the well-being of residents and the broader community.

Details about the Bentley Road supportive housing facility unfolded during the meeting, assuring attendees of a front desk manned by a minimum of two staff members 24/7. There was a commitment to meeting 5% or 10% accessibility requirements in housing, ensuring inclusivity. Stakeholders emphasized the creation of a cohesive community through partnerships with various stakeholders within the community.

Having been with Promise Vancouver for nearly four years, Daniel is deeply committed to its mission. Promise Vancouver is a non-profit organization in the Downtown Eastside focused on supporting local youth, aligning perfectly with his desire to make a positive impact within the community.

Six years after his internships with the Downtown Surrey BIA, Daniel has advanced in his career and continues to serve passionately in his role at Promise Vancouver. Reflecting on his time with the Downtown Surrey BIA, Daniel acknowledges the invaluable lessons learned and the diverse experiences he gained. His internships allowed him to undertake multiple projects across different disciplines, expanding his network and exploring various fields such as videography, marketing, urban development, community building, and planning. Daniel highlights the continued connection with other DSBIA interns, illustrating the lasting impact of these experiences.
